Amatola Water Board is a state-owned, South African water utility established in November 1997 and is mandated to render water services to water sector institutions, to local government and other customers in the Eastern Cape.

Tenders are hereby invited from suitably qualified and experienced contractors who are registered with CIDB for the Completion of Remedial and Repair Works to Various Water Schemes within the Amatola Water Region and Surrounding Municipal Areas - 3 Year Construction Programme.

Scope of Work	
1.	SCOPE OF WORK The scope of work for this Contract is to construct and commission as and when ordered the works identified by Amatola Water on its capital infrastructure as well as uncompleted projects in various areas of service.
	The works under this Contract includes:
	 General works not yet identified (Water); Pump stations General site works/landscaping, bush clearing and fencing repairs; Pipeline and manhole repairs as/where required.

Bulk mains

- General site works / landscaping and bush clearing;
- Leak detection and repair;
- Pipeline repairs and/or replacement;
- Repairs to and/or replacement of air, isolating, scour & control valves as required;
- Chamber repairs (raise, lower, vents, lids, locking bars etc.); and
- New air, scour, isolating & control valves and flow meter installations complete with chambers.

Reservoirs

- General site works / landscaping, bush clearing and fencing repairs;
- Repairs and/or replacement of pipework & fittings;
- New air, scour, isolating & control valves and flow meter installations complete with chambers;
- Completion of concrete walls, floor and roof slabs, as well as masonry works; and
- Leak detection and repairs.

CIDB REGISTRATION GRADE AND CLASS OF WORKS – 7CE OR HIGHER

Only tenderers who are registered with the CIDB (or capable of being so prior to the evaluation of submissions), in a contractor grading designation equal to, or higher, than 7CE and who are also able to satisfy the prequalification criteria stated in the tender data, are eligible to tender.

COMPULSORY BID CLARIFICATION MEETING

There will be no site clarification meeting.

BID CONDITIONS

- The 2017 Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act 2000 (PPPFA) principles shall apply, whereby submissions will be evaluated accordingly to the provisions of the Act.
- Tenders which are late, incomplete, unsigned or submitted electronically will not be accepted.
- All tenders are to remain valid for a period of 12 weeks from the closing date of the submission.
- Failure to provide supplementary information specified and completion of the returnable schedules will result in the tender being regarded as non-responsive.
- Tender Forms (Form C1.1: Form of Offer and Acceptance) that are incomplete or incorrectly completed will result in the disqualification of the tender.
- Amatola Water does not bind itself to accept the lowest or any tender and reserves the right to accept any tender or portion of tender.

LOCAL CONTENT AND PRODUCTION

Contractors submitting tender offers should please note that certain designated local content and production material will be required to be supplied as part of this bid. Contractors are required to comply with the provisions of the National Treasury Instruction Notes relevant to the specific designated commodities.

EVALUATION CRITERIA

The 80/20 preference points system as prescribed in the Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2017 Pertaining to the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act, (ACT No 5 of 2000) (PPPFA) will be applied to evaluate all bids. The lowest acceptable bid will score 80 points for price and a maximum of 20 points will be awarded depending on the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment (B-BBEE) Status Level of Contribution. Bids received will be evaluated in two (2) phases; namely Mandatory Requirements and Price and Preference.

BID PUBLICATION

An open competitive bidding process is to be followed. A bid invitation will be published in the regional newspaper, National Treasury Website, CIDB and Amatola Water Website.

A non-refundable fee of R800.00 is payable for each set of bid documents. Payment is to be made by either bank deposit or Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT) only (no cash or cheque payments will be accepted) and is to be made payable to Amatola Water, Standard Bank, Account No. 081075138, Branch Code: 050021

The tender closing date will be for a minimum of 21 days (3 weeks) after the advertising date. The closing time will be 11:00 am. The Bid documents are to be deposited in Amatola Water's Tender Box, 6 Lancaster Road, Vincent, East London.

BID SUBMISSION

Tenders will close on the 13th October 2020 @ 11h00.

The original completed bid documents must be submitted in a sealed envelope or parcel endorsed with the Bid Number and Bid Description as detailed in the Tender Data.
